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3. Product Introduction



3.1 Intended Use

This product is designed to facilitate high-volume air delivery in automotive, commercial, industrial and agricultural environments to extract and replace confined, stale, hot or fume-laden air. Any other application beyond the conditions established for use will be considered misuse. Draper Tools accepts no responsibility for improper use of this product.

Part of our core range, this product is suitable for use by enthusiasts and tradespersons alike.

WARNING! This product is not a toy and must be respected.

Read this manual in full before attempting to assemble, operate or maintain the product, and retain it for later use.

4.1 General Health and Safety Precautions

- This appliance is not suitable for use by children and may not be used by persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience or knowledge unless they are supervised or trained in the correct use of the device and fully understand the hazards involved.
 - DO NOT allow children to play with the appliance.
 - Cleaning and maintenance MUST be carried out by or under the supervision of experienced and knowledgeable persons.
- Observe all standard safety protocols and good practices while working with electrical devices and rotating blades.
- Inspect the product before every use for cracked, corroded or broken parts.
- WARNING! DO NOT use this product if it is damaged in any way. Contact Draper Tools for repair and replacement options.
- DO NOT abuse the power cable.
 - **DO NOT** carry the appliance by the power cable.
 - DO NOT tug or pull on the power cable to disconnect the plug from a power outlet.
 - DO NOT handle the power cable or plug with wet hands.
 - DO NOT immerse the power cable in water or other liquids.
 - Keep the cable away from oils, grease and heated or sharp surfaces that may damage it.
- DO NOT attempt to disassemble or modify this product in any way.
- Use this product only as instructed in this manual.
- Use only replacement parts supplied by Draper Tools.

4.2 Additional Safety Information for This Ventilator

- Dress appropriately and keep long hair, jewellery and loose-fitting clothing tied back to avoid snagging while using this product.
- Wear hearing protection when working near this product for extended periods and position the fan unit away from the space to be ventilated during operation where possible.
- The fan unit **MUST** be positioned indoors and protected from rain.
- Position the fan on a firm, flat and level surface capable of supporting the unit during use.
- DO NOT position the product on or near soft or fibrous surfaces that may cause long or loose strands to be drawn into the fan blades.
- DO NOT position this product in any environment in which dust or ash are present as they may be drawn into the fan and damage the product or cause air pollution when expelled.
- DO NOT install this product in the vicinity of gas appliances, open flames, and cooling or heating appliances.
- ALWAYS install the fan in its upright position.
- Ensure that any ducting is attached to the product BEFORE connecting a power supply and switching the fan on.
- Ensure that the mains outlet to which the product is connected is accessible at all times.
- **DO NOT** run the power cable beneath a carpet or rug.
- Take any necessary precautions to ensure that extracted air does not flow back into the space from which it was removed.
- Ensure that the air inlet is clear and unobstructed.
- NEVER cover any part of the fan and ensure that the inlet and outlet grilles remain unobstructed.
- DO NOT insert your fingers or other foreign objects through the grille while the fan is running and avoid contact with moving parts.
- NEVER direct the air flow towards yourself or others.
- **DO NOT** leave the product running unattended.

4. Health and Safety Information



- DO NOT use this product with a programmer, timer, separate remote-control system or any other device that switches the fan on automatically as it may be covered or positioned incorrectly when activated and cause a hazard
- ALWAYS switch off the fan, disconnect it from mains power and allow the fan blades to completely stop before removing the grille or performing any cleaning, maintenance or moving the product.
- WARNING! This product is NOT suitable for use in flammable environments or where flammable fumes or materials may be drawn into the ventilator and ducting. DO NOT use this product to extract flammable fumes and gases.
- If you are in any doubt about the safety the environment to be ventilated or extracted, seek advice from a specialist before use.

4.3 Connection to the Power Supply

WARNING! Risk of electric shock. DO NOT open this product.

This appliance is supplied with an approved plug and cable for your safety.

If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by a special cord or assembly available from Draper Tools or its service agent. The damaged or incomplete plug, when cut from the cable, must be disabled to prevent connection to a live electrical outlet.

This product is Class I* and is designed for connection **ONLY** to a power supply matching that detailed on the rating label and compatible with the plug fitted.

The value of the fuse fitted is marked on the pin face of the plug. Should the fuse need replacing, ensure the substitute is of the correct rating, approved to BS 1363/A and ASTA or BS Kite marked. This should only be performed by suitably qualified personnel.

The fuse can be replaced by removing the cover using a small plain slot screwdriver and removing the broken fuse from its holder. This should only be performed by suitably qualified personnel.

If an extension lead is required, use an approved and compatible lead rated for this appliance. Follow all the instructions supplied with the extension lead.

Important: Always follow the extension lead instructions regarding maximum load while the cable is wound. If in doubt, unwind the entire cable. A coiled extension lead generates heat which could melt the lead and cause a fire.

*Earthed: This product requires an earth connection to protect against electric shock from accessible conductive parts in the event of a failure of the basic insulation.



5.2 Packaging

Keep the product packaging for the duration of the warranty period in case the product needs to be returned for repair.

6.1 Attaching and Positioning the Ducting

The ducting should be installed before every use. Attach the ducting to the appropriate end of the fan unit according to the operation.

Extraction

- If the fan is located outside the space to be treated, attach the ducting to the inlet (1) of the fan unit.
- If the fan is located inside the space to be treated, attach the ducting to the outlet (5) of the fan unit.

Ventilation

- If the fan is located outside the space to be treated, attach the ducting to the outlet (5) of the fan unit.
- If the fan is located inside the space to be treated, attach the ducting to the inlet (1) of the fan unit.

Important: For most operations, Draper Tools recommends that the fan is located away from the space to be treated to reduce exposure to noise emissions.

To attach the ducting to the fan unit - Fig. 1:

- Pull one end of the ducting over the appropriate part of the fan, then pull the drawstring tight and knot it securely.
- 2. Fully extend the ducting and keep it as flat as possible to minimise restrictions to the airflow.
- Position the fan unit or the open end of the ducting as appropriate as far from the space to be treated as possible and take precaution to prevent the backflow of air to its original location.
 - The ducting is fitted with locating lugs at various points to allow it to be suspended or secured if required.



6. Operating Instructions



6.2 Operating the Fan

WARNING! Ensure that the ducting is attached to the unit and that the unit and the ducting are correctly positioned BEFORE connecting the product to a power supply and switching it on.

1. Position the fan unit as required for the operation.

Important: The fan unit **MUST** be positioned indoors and protected from rain.

- Attach the ducting to the fan unit as appropriate for the operation and position it as required; see 6.1 Attaching and Positioning the Ducting.
- For some extraction operations, it may be beneficial to close or cover any entrances and apertures into the space to be treated to avoid drawing further air from outside the space through the ventilator.

- 4. Connect the power cable to a power supply.
- 5. Move the power switch (4) to the ON position to start the fan rotor.

Important: When switching off the product, move the power switch to the OFF position, disconnect the power supply and wait for the blades to completely stop before moving or maintaining it.

7. Maintenance and Storage



Important: Read all the safety information listed in this manual before attempting to maintain, service or repair this product.

WARNING! ALWAYS ensure that the fan is switched off, disconnected from mains power and that the blades have completely stopped before working on this product.

CAUTION! DO NOT allow water to enter the motor housing while cleaning the product

- Clean the grilles and blades using a damp cloth ONLY.
 - NEVER use solvents or aggressive chemicals for cleaning as these may damage the plastic or insulated parts of the fan.

- DO NOT spray the fan unit or immerse it in water.
- · Clean the fan thoroughly before storage.
- When storing the unit, cover it in a plastic bag to protect it from dust and store it in a clean and dry location out of reach of children.
- Disconnect the power supply when the product will not be used for extended periods.

Important: This product contains no user-serviceable parts. If your product requires any maintenance beyond regular cleaning, contact Draper Tools for support.

8. Spares, Returns and Disposal



For spare parts, servicing, and repair and replacement options, please contact the Draper Tools Product Helpline for details of your nearest authorised agent.

Draper Tools will endeavour to hold any spare parts, if applicable, for seven years from the date that it sells the final matching stock item.

Any servicing or repairs carried out by unauthorised personnel or installation of spare parts not supplied by Draper Tools will invalidate your warranty.

At the end of its working life, dispose of the product responsibly and in line with local regulations. Recycle where possible.
